Our Curriculum & Learning Environment

"Working hard; playing hard"

Hemington Primary School provides a rich and diverse curriculum which we have tailored to complement our setting and community. We work hard to ensure each child makes good progress whatever their starting points.

Teachers are experienced at teaching across the year groups and ensure appropriate challenge for all, including those who are more able whilst supporting and including those who may require extra assistance. We expect pupils to work hard, but we also value the whole child through the wider curriculum. All pupils have dance, drama and music sessions; older pupils learn to play the ukulele; we stage high quality performances and develop artistic skills; we offer a wide variety of sports including swimming and football; we develop resilience through outdoor adventure and challenge; we develop the STEM subjects of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths through hands-on learning opportunities; we extend IT skills through the use of a comprehensive computing curriculum using up-to-date technology.

Every child has the opportunity to experience Forest School on a weekly basis, led by our trained Forest School practitioner. Over the years, we have emphasised the benefits of working outside as it increases health, well-being and social skills as well as making all aspects of learning more hands on and exciting.









Extra currícular

"Developing the whole child"

Breakfast Club: Our breakfast club runs every school day from 7.30am.

After School Clubs: We run a number of afterschool clubs throughout the year such as Lego Club, Multi-Sports, Cookery, Football, Music and curriculum clubs (Spaghetti Maths).

Residential visits: Visits are offered to children in **Years 4, 5 and 6**. These visits include outdoor activities e.g abseiling, rock walks, den building and team activities. In previous years, we have visited Mount Cook Adventure Centre, YHA Sherwood Forest, YHA Coalbrook Dale and are soon to visit Whitemoor Lakes in Lichfield.

Red Dot Drama: Children throughout the school have opportunities to develop dance and drama skills with an external theatre company. They showcase productions in outside venues each year.

Soccer Stars PE Providers: Soccer Stars provide coaching during our PE lessons throughout school. They cover a wide range of sports from athletics to gymnastics.

Swimming: Years 3-6 take part in swimming lessons at Whitwick and Coalville Leisure centre during the autumn term.

Music: Children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 have the opportunity to learn the ukulele each week. Ukulele performances are given to parents at Christmas and at the end of the year.
